ORDINANCE NO. 2025-680

AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING EXTRACTION FEES ON ALL MINERAL ORE COVERED BY MINERAL PRODUCTION SHARING AGREEMENT (MPSA) AND ALL OTHER MINERAL ORE RESIDUES, STOCKPILED ORES, AND ALL FORMS OF MINERAL ORE WASTE FOUND WITHIN THE PROVINCE OF ZAMBOANGA SIBUGAY PER APPROVED SP RESOLUTION NO. 2022-8604 AND PROVIDING TRANSPORT PERMITS TO BE ISSUED BY THE REGIONAL DIRECTOR OF THE MINES AND GEOSCIENCES BUREAU (MGB) IN THE CASE OF MPSA, AND THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PROVINCIAL MINING REGULATORY BOARD (PMRB) OR BY THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNOR PURSUANT TO DENR ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 2009-01 AND BY THIS ORDINANCE.

BE ENACTED, by the 8TH SANGGUNIANG PANLALAWIGAN of the **PROVINCE OF ZAMBOANGA SIBUGAY**.

ORDAINED THAT:

Section 1. Title. - This ordinance shall be known and thereafter referred to as "AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING EXTRACTION FEES ON ALL MINERAL ORE COVERED BY MINERAL PRODUCTION SHARING AGREEMENT (MPSA) AND ALL OTHER MINERAL ORE RESIDUES, STOCKPILED ORES, AND ALL FORMS OF MINERAL ORE WASTE FOUND WITHIN THE PROVINCE OF ZAMBOANGA SIBUGAY PER APPROVED SP RESOLUTION NO. 2022-8604 AND PROVIDING TRANSPORT PERMITS TO BE ISSUED BY THE REGIONAL DIRECTOR OF THE MINES AND GEOSCIENCES BUREAU (MGB) IN THE CASE OF MPSA, AND THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PROVINCIAL MINING REGULATORY BOARD (PMRB) OR BY THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNOR PURSUANT TO DENR ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 2009-01 AND BY THIS ORDINANCE".

Section 2. Environmental Hazards. - The existence of the uncollected stockpile of mineral residues extracted during the validity of the small-scale mining permits issued by the provincial governor of this province, continue to pose environmental hazard due to the presence of residues of exposed mercury, sulphur, acid, carbon, and similar destructive chemicals and substances that are located in the mountains and are carried down by rains and floods that adversely affects human lives and properties.

Section 3. Coverage - For purposes of the imposition of fees and other charges, all mineral ore under MPSA, leftover, uncollected, stockpiled residual mineral ore or any waste of mineral ore anywhere located in the province are deemed extracted under and in pursuant to a previously issued valid mining permit or pursuant to other relevant laws and regulations, and therefore subject to extraction fees imposed by Provincial Ordinance No. 2008-271 and by this Ordinance.

Section 4. Requirements. - In transporting the aforementioned mineral ore, the following requirements shall be complied with, to wit:

1. Letter of Intent;

2. Duly complied Application form;

Verification Report of the concerned MENRO or PENRO of the province;

 Copy of the previously issued <u>Governor's Permit</u> and the corresponding <u>Environment Compliance Certificate (ECC)</u>;

 Affidavit of undertaking that the applicant shall assume and settle third party or landowner's claim;

6. Payment of the one percent (1%) NCIP Royalty;

7. Proof of payment of the corresponding extractions fees with the Provincial Treasurer's Office (PTO);

 Certificate of Compliance Cum Order of Payment – A certificate of compliance with the provisions of this ordinance and Order of Payment shall first be secured in the Office of the Sanggunian before payment of the required fees and the issuance of the corresponding OTP or MOEP.

9. Application and Service Fees for Ore Transport Permit (OTP) or Mineral Ore Export Permit (MOEP) – The Provincial Treasurer's Office (PTO) is hereby authorized to collect and receive application and service fees in the amount of Ten Thousand Pesos (P10,000.00) for Ore Transport Permit (OTP) and Twenty Thousand Pesos (P20,000.00) for Mineral Ore Transport Permit (MOEP) to be issued by the provincial governor or the chairman of the Provincial Mining Regulatory Board (PMRB), as the case may be.

Section 5. Mineral Ore Waste Transport Requirements. – That in the case of extracted mineral ore wastes or ore residue collected for cleansing the mountains of hazardous chemicals or environmentally hazard substances in the province, the following requirements are to be complied with:

1. Letter of Intent;

2. Application form duly complied and filed;

3. Verification Report of the concerned MENRO or PENRO of the province;

 Affidavit of undertaking that the applicant shall assume and settle third party or landowner's claim;

5. Proof of payment of the one percent (1%) per kilo as NCIP/IPs Royalty fee;

Proof of payment of the corresponding extractions fees with the Provincial Treasurer's Office (PTO);

Certificate of Compliance Cum Order of Payment – A certificate of
compliance with the provisions of the requirement of this ordinance and
Order of Payment shall first be secured in the Office of the Sanggunian
or its authorized representative before payment of the required fees and
the issuance of the corresponding OTP or MOEP.

8. Proof of Payment of Application and Service Fees for Ore Transport Permit (OTP) or Mineral Ore Export Permit (MOEP) dully issued by the Provincial Treasurer's Office (PTO) in the amount of Ten Thousand Pesos (P10,000.00) for Ore Transport Permit (OTP) and Twenty Thousand Pesos (P20,000.00) for Mineral Ore Transport Permit (MOEP).

Section 6. Separability Clause - If, for any reason or reasons, any part or provision hereof shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 7. Repealing Clause. All ordinances, resolutions, or laws of local application and effect inconsistent hereto are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.


Section 8. Effectivity - Pursuant to the pertinent provisions of Section 59 of Republic Act No. 7160, this ordinance shall take effect on the 1st of January 2025 and after ten (10) days from the date a copy thereof is posted in a bulletin board at the entrance of the Provincial Capitol, and in at least two (2) other conspicuous places thereof.
